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Introduction

At Scripture Union, we seek to honor God in all that we do and take very seriously the safety of all to whom we minister, particularly our volunteers and children. We believe safety leads to trusting relationships; and it is through trusting relationships that children and young people come to know Jesus and have faith.

Therefore, we believe safety and harm prevention are equally as important as sharing the Gospel.

Risk management is everyone's responsibility. The Risk Assessment Library is Scripture Union's solution so that we may all be above reproach.



What is the Risk Assessment Library?

The Risk Assessment Library is a collection of risk plans for all the activities that SU Australia has insurance cover for.

A risk plan is:

• A list of identifiable foreseeable risks, their management, and treatment methods.

The goal of a risk plan is to wherever possible reduce the risk factor to an appropriate level, therefore, minimizing the likelihood of each risk.

While the Risk Assessment Library is a detailed guide, it is not exhaustive. People and locations associated with these activities still need to be taken into consideration when creating your Safety Management Plan.

For activities not listed in this Library please contact your SU representative for further information.

What do we have risk assessments of?

- SU has insurance for a set list of activities. Therefore, there is risk plan for each of the declared activities.



Likelihood & Consequence Definitions

Likelihood Descriptor	Description
Common	Can be expected to occur with some frequency; a repeating event; not a surprise when it happens
Possible	Known to happen or has happened; might occur a handful of times in your experience
Unlikely	Could happen; heard of it happening; occurs somewhere from time to time
Rare	Highly unexpected; not likely; have heard of happening somewhere once
Very Rare	Theoretically possible but incredibly unlikely

- Many popular vertues have ineguard services, depending on the time of year. Your team may have chosen to swim in a location with a lifeguard of duty this is an appropriate way to keep your group safe. The lifeguard may be included under these guidelines as a qualified rescuer. While you can expect the lifeguard to assist if rescue is required, they will not be actively supervising your group. This is still your responsibility.
- There should always be at least two non-participating team leaders supervising, one of whom is qualified for that water environment.
- The highest levels of Duty of Care must be taken when running activities in open water. The majority of drowning and near-drowning incidents occur in home swimming pools and in open water. Of those 5 14 years who drown in Australia, 32% did so in natural bodies of water. A similar figure is reported for drowning deaths in those 15 24 years of age. A risk of drowning can be present during any water-based activity, even when swimming is not allowed.
- Other aquatic activities such as canoeing, sailing, and water skiing have their own specific guidelines to which you should refer. The overall responsibility for safety rests with the Team Director, who might delegate supervision of swimming to a team member in charge (usually the team member with rescue qualifications).
