



Meeting Jesus on Camp

For Scripture Union, camps are more than new adventures—they're transformative.

I remember the moment as if it were yesterday. It was January 1985, I was 17 years old and attending a camp on the outskirts of Sydney. I should have been preparing to head back to high school, but instead, I was already working.

My last few years at high school had been difficult so I left school at the end of year 9 to take a job with the State Rail Authority. Being adopted, I really struggled with understanding who I was and where I was going. Leaving school early and getting a job seemed, at least to me, like a good option. I would finally have control.

But when I attended that camp, I realised I still had very little control over my life. I don't remember much about the camp in terms of its programs, talks, or even who

was there. What I do remember was the final night. I was feeling troubled, and God had begun to do His work in me.

It was around lam, and I was in a clearing surrounded by tall gum trees. A leader at the camp found me, and I began to share how I felt unloved, unwanted, and worthless. The leader opened the Bible and read John 3:16 to me. He then read it again and inserted my name.

"For God so loved Ian...."

"In that moment I felt the love of God. I felt fully loved for the first time."

That revelation rang through my spirit and I went from feeling worthless, to knowing that I am worthwhile - worth dying for. It was, and still is, life-changing. Right there, in the early morning hours, I committed to being allin for Jesus. That decision has guided my life ever since.

My story is one that has been experienced by many young people in every one of Scripture Union's camps. These moments are the reason that Scripture Union in NSW is committed to enabling children and young people to attend a camp; so that they might hear and respond to the Good News of Jesus.

Putting Wheels on Dreams

From Idea to Reality: Ride like a Girl Camp.

Bec had a vision that went beyond the saddle – to give girls a place to ride, bond, and hear the Gospel.

Growing up in Armidale, Bec's life had always been intertwined with horses. She had a desire to combine her twin passions of horses and her work of teaching at the local high school. She saw an opportunity – a space where girls could combine their love for horses with their faith.

She shared her idea with her friend Julia, a fellow horse lover and jump marshal. Julia dropped everything, and said, 'I've been praying that God would use me for something like this.'

At that moment, Bec and Julia went out to the horse yards and together prayed a bold prayer - that if this was from God, He would make a way.

Taking the idea and making it a reality did not come without its challenges. Bec reached out to Dave at Scripture Union who shared in her excitement. He revealed that there was an available funding pool for drought-affected families, precisely targeting the demographic they had in mind. The timing was amazing.

Insurance, a colossal hurdle, seemed insurmountable.

"We've seen really big claims in recent years for some horse accidents that have happened in the millions. So insurers have gone a bit quiet on wanting to fund horse camps".

Thankfully, Dave continued to encourage and reassure her that 'no rock is too large for God'.

So, they kept persevering until they exhausted all possible avenues and got a breakthrough thanks to Equestrian Australia.





Just when things seemed to start falling into place, they faced more hurdles. Heavy rains, flooding, and the onset of Covid-19 resulted in not only having to find a new venue to host the camp, but also sleeping quarters to house the campers.

In a desperate last minute attempt to find a new location, they contacted The Tamworth Pace Way, a showground with an undercover grandstand and stables for each girl. "They only had one date in 12 months available for a camp, and it just happened to be on the date we proposed and within our exact budget!"

A local church stepped in to support with accommodation. Covid restrictions forced the numbers to 20 within the space - again - the exact number of registered girls. "It seemed to us that every time we had a problem that was threatening to close the camp down, we got a solution."

"We felt like God was using our problems that were almost catastrophic, to grant us a better solution."

Bec recalls: "That first camp, we got there by the skin of our teeth, but it was such a success".

A highlight for Bec was seeing one of the girls and her mother walk into church for the first time the morning after the camp. She's been coming to church ever since! Another special outcome is seeing how the community has really gotten behind the camp - they loan horses each year for the girls to use.

The camp has been very successful and has become a space where girls not only hone their riding skills but also their understanding of themselves and their faith.

The camp is heading into its fourth year and is focused on fostering leadership and growth while connecting with girls over a shared passion of horses. The age range has now expanded to include girls up to Year 11 to create an environment where older girls can support and mentor the younger riders that attend.

Bec and her team are currently in the process of designing a followup program that creates builtin opportunities for leadership development.




A Scripture Union camp for everyone

Over the past decade, SU NSW camps have flourished, expanding from around ten to over forty camps - a testament to God's blessings and the dedication of the incredible volunteers involved.











