





We're not shrinking back in sharing the Good News

I was recently challenged by the stories of those persecuted because of their faith in Jesus. These men and women have been jailed, beaten, or even killed because they choose to follow, worship, speak and proclaim the name of Jesus.

Open Doors reports that 360 million Christians are currently suffering high levels of persecution because of their faith. In the last year alone, 5,898 Christians have been killed because they chose to follow Jesus. Very few of us in the west will ever face persecution of this magnitude.

There are certainly challenges facing Christians in Australia – doors are being closed, CEO's are losing their jobs, and we at Scripture Union in NSW are constantly hearing of Principals who are saying 'no' to lunchtime groups and SRE, in both primary and high school settings.

While this can be disheartening, it's not comparable to the reports and stories coming from Christian movements across the world.

As I observe the challenges and pushback from secular society, it seems (at least to me) that it has more to do with the church's view on specific issues that are at odds with the secular world. It's not so much about the name, person and the Good News message of Jesus.

One of the things that I am most proud of when it comes to Scripture Union is the unapologetic commitment to making the Good News of Jesus known to children, young people and families.

"It's Jesus we encourage people to commit to - and people are turning to Him. During the Spring holiday period, we saw 30 young people give their lives to Jesus at one of our camps!" As we head towards the 2022/2023 mission season, 25 teams (around 1,000 volunteers) are preparing to take the Good News of Jesus to beaches and holiday destinations across the NSW Coast. Christians from all walks of life will come together and step out of their comfort zones to share the love of God with holidaymakers. There's excitement in my spirit as I consider what's possible!

Please join me in praying for all the volunteers and if you are able, consider partnering with us in our Christmas appeal as we make His Good News known this summer.

From Small Beginnings

Janice's Story

We recently sat down with Janice, a long-term supporter of SU NSW. Seventy years ago Janice was given a Scripture Union resource - a Bible reading plan - and it changed her life forever. The seed began to grow and grow. Since then, it has produced much fruit in Janice's life and in many others as a result.

As a young child, Janice would watch the other kids in the neighbourhood travel back and forth to Sunday school in their 'Sunday best'. She longed to join them. But even more so, she longed to know about Jesus.

In Janice's family, there was a strong belief that 'all problems were caused by religion'. She was discouraged from exploring Christianity and banned from any church connection. That didn't deter Janice - she was determined to know Jesus. However, getting a bible was going to be a challenge.

A local church had a Sunday School incentive arrangement. If you could 'prove' your weekly church attendance over a year, you would be eligible to receive a Bible. This gave Janice an idea, and at the age of eight, she concocted a bold plan. In her eyes, this was the key to securing her very own Bible.

She would 'buy' her friend's Sunday School attendance forms - those who didn't care much about getting a Bible. And when she finally had enough, she would bravely approach the front steps of the Sunday School mistress' home, present her forms, and claim her prize. And hope she wouldn't suspect!

Janice set to work doing chores, even collecting manure from nearby fields to sell. With all her heart she wanted that Bible! And by some small miracle, Janice's plan succeeded.

She recalls:

"Finally I got a Bible, but had no idea how to read it. It fell open at Psalm 119, so I started to read that. My parents didn't worry because they didn't think an eight-year-old was going to understand anything out of a King James Bible."

Janice began waking up at 2am to read under the covers. For her, this book was as precious as treasure. God's Word became the 'light to her path' and started to take seed in her heart.

High school was a time of growth for Janice's faith. A girl in her class called Joy, was very enthusiastic about wanting everybody to have a Scripture Union card, which had a daily Bible reading schedule.

Suddenly she had a pattern for being able to read her Bible, and that was very exciting. Joy would come and check to see how she was going - and Janice thought that was wonderful!







From this point on, Scripture Union became a defining influence in Janice's life and faith.

She was invited to a SU camp-Camp Bevington in Budgewoi (NSW) and it was at this camp that she gave her life to Christ.

"Everything just clicked. I knew that I had to have the Lord in my life and I had to be definite. So I inked my name on the decision card on the 2nd of January, 1954. That's a date I'll never forget."

Scripture Union continued to play a major role in Janice's budding faith. She attended ISCF at school and other Scripture Union programs where she made Christian friends and learnt how to read her Bible, pray, share her testimony, and was given opportunities to grow in leadership.

As Janice got married to her husband Bill and started a family, Scripture Union remained a big part of their life. The whole family attended SUFM Beach Missions.

Bill and Janice were on the leadership team and their children were 'Team Kids.' Those summer missions have formed some of their fondest memories.

Today, Janice and her family are still involved in Scripture Union in any way they can. She is so encouraged hearing the testimonies coming from ISCF and other mission programs - the same programs that transformed her life forever.

Jancie shares: "Scripture Union is always there to encourage the little remnant and grow the seeds of faith. It's a real blessing to look back and see the fruit that's come from those few little seeds in this totally insignificant kid that really had nothing going for her."

"SU has been there from the very beginning. I couldn't be more thankful."

Noah was born with cerebral palsy. Like most kids starting school, he was excited about this new chapter - making new friendships and growing in independence.

Early into term one of
Kindergarten, Noah started
having dangerous seizures
with increasing frequency and,
after much consultation, it was
decided that urgent surgery was
required to disconnect the half
of the brain that was causing
constant seizures.

Since the surgery, Noah has lived with half a brain. This has limited his function on one side of his body. Noah was being homeschooled by his mother, Cath, who had to weave teaching in amidst the constant stream of doctors appointments.

Life hasn't been easy for Noah's family. A year ago, Otto (Noah's dad), was diagnosed with cancer, and tragically passed away on Noah's 13th birthday. Cath is now raising 3 boys (13, 11 and 9) on her own.

Earlier this year, Kylie Letcher (Western Districts Regional Worker at SU NSW) met with Cath and asked if Noah would consider coming to SU NSW's Boys Ag Camp. After discussions with Steve and Caitlyn (the amazing Camp Directors), they made a plan to accommodate for Noah - to create a welcoming environment where he could feel included and thrive.

Cath was overjoyed that Noah could attend. She commented, "He LOVED it! He made friends straight away! Thank you so much for the encouragement to move forward with it. I am so thankful to the whole Boys Ag team who worked hard to cater for him."

"I am grateful Scripture Union could provide a place to bring him so much joy in the midst of a very hard year. I'm thankful to God for giving our family this blessing."

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
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
