



## Bill Andersen's Legacy



Reflecting on Bill Andersen's generational impact and how we can continue to run the race that Jesus has called us to.

Hebrews 12 speaks about being surrounded by "a great cloud of witness" and urges us to "fix our eyes on Jesus" as we run the race before us.

History is full of great Christian leaders who have gone before us, who have run the race with their eyes firmly fixed on Jesus, leaving us an example and legacy to build on as we now run the race that Jesus has called us to.

Bill was instrumental in drafting what we now call the Scripture Union Aims, Beliefs, and Working Principles\*, a document that directly influences and shapes the international movement of Scripture Union.

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For Scripture Union in NSW, one of our great witnesses was Dr Bill Andersen, a great man of faith, a great leader and a great visionary who impacted the work of Scripture Union on a global scale.

While Bill was called home to be with our Lord in 2019, his impact and legacy on Scripture Union in NSW cannot be underestimated or overstated. At the celebration of Bill's 75 years of service with Scripture Union, he was asked:

"What do you hope and pray Scripture Union will be doing 75 years from now?"

Bill answered by saying that he hoped Scripture Union would do two things:

- 1. Continue doing the things it has been doing; and
- Discover new ways of confronting boys and girls with the Good News of Jesus and have its mind wide open for innovative things and opportunities.

Bill could see a changing world with new opportunities to impact children, young people and families with the Good News of Jesus. All of us at Scripture Union NSW are committed to doing just that, to finding new and innovative ways of making the Good News known while keeping our eyes firmly fixed on Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith.



A lifetime commitment to 'make God's Good News known to children, young people and families.'



When Bill was in year 7 he was told of the Good News of Jesus Christ in an SRE class at Fort Street Boys' High School. The teacher involved was part of a new movement that had commenced that previous year in 1935 throughout Sydney high schools. This was called Inter-School Christian Fellowship (ISCF).

His ISCF group met regularly during lunchtime and Bill became one of the students who was encouraged to grow in leadership and profited greatly from attending statewide leadership training conferences.

During his senior years of schooling and while studying at Sydney University, Bill was involved in many ISCF camps and began to lead monthly meetings of student leaders from various ISCF groups around Sydney.

His involvement with Scripture Union began to increase and after serving in the war, he took on the role of General Secretary of SU Queensland running the office and also leading Camps, Beach Missions and Children's Missions. All this, and Bill was only in his 20s!

Bill returned to Sydney to finish his Psychology degree and became involved with the Evangelical Union at Sydney University serving as President. He began to teach at Wyong High and Punchbowl Boys High where he started the ISCF group and trained student leaders.

He married his wife Ruth, and together, they were extremely committed to the ministry of SU.

Bill was given leadership responsibilities with Scripture Union in the East Asia-Pacific region. During his time serving as Chairman, he attended the first International SU Conference in Harare, Zimbabwe, held in 1985. At this conference, Bill presented drafts of the SU Aims, Beliefs and Working Principles document, which were discussed and

accepted. Some see this as one of Bill's greatest achievements.

Scripture Union was – and still is – a diverse organisation made up of people from various denominational backgrounds and Christian traditions. But through his extraordinary leadership, Bill was able to bring people together under a statement they could all agree to. Even more than that, Bill was able to create a document that would anchor and inspire SU work for years to come. The Statement of Belief, in particular, bears Bill's fingerprints in its artful and poetic language. It reflects the core tenants of the Bible - something that Bill was keen to capture and in a non-divisive way. This document is still in use internationally today.

In 2010, Bill was appointed as a Member of the Order of Australia for his service to the Scripture Union Movement. His response was;



It's actually Scripture Union's service to me which has been fundamental and highly formative in who I am. I was caught up in this movement; a current with an orientation towards Jesus. I am the one who has been served well.

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## SU from old to new

Bill was extremely involved with SU throughout his life, and he leaves a profound legacy for our organisation. Bill is remembered as a man of great integrity, faith and humility.

- 1. His time in a Peruvian City on the banks of the Amazon, an area where the plight of street children was deplorable. Scripture Union was able to build a Centre where kids could be occupied in helpful and interesting ways, commence regular schooling and find protection. All of this was funded by SU children in Germany!
- **2.** Another great experience was to accept an invitation from a group of Christians in Ukraine to provide training seminars for those particularly interested in working with children.



# Passing the baton of faith from one generation to the next

How a life-changing year with Scripture Union NSW led Jeremy Kidd to pursue a career in sharing the Gospel and growing young Christian leaders.

## What did your SU internship involve?

Throughout my internship, I was able to get ministry experience across every area that Scripture Union supports. I led on many camps, missions, conferences and helped in training student leaders in my old high school lunchtime group as well as a local SUPA Club.

At SUNSW, interns can learn through hands-on experience alongside key SU team members, while being paid for their valuable part-time work and pursuing formal studies. Throughout my one year internship, I had the privilege of engaging with many inspiring people who use their various passions to make God's Good News known.

## How has SU impacted your personal faith in Jesus?

I can confidently say that SU was foundational in my growth as a young Christian. My time with SU has led me to pursue full-time ministry through an MTS Ministry Apprenticeship and study with Sydney Missionary and Bible College (SMBC).

Serving as a volunteer and intern with SU has developed me as a leader. It has created in me a deep desire to make disciples. I really want to continue being involved in the Great Commission of Jesus.

A highlight of my internship was accompanying 'Parko' (Andrew Parkinson, Regional Team Leader) to encourage and support ministry in country towns across NSW. When I visited Broken Hill in 2017, the community were facing an intense drought. It dawned on me during that visit that it was not only the land that was dry. Our country is spiritually dry. There are so many who have not come to Jesus, the Living Water, and the only one who can save and truly satisfy. My eyes were opened to the importance to share the Gospel message.

## How do you feel that SU has helped you develop as a leader?

Serving as a volunteer and intern with SU has developed me as a leader. It has created in me a deep desire to make disciples. I really want to continue being involved in the Great Commission of Jesus.

That's also why I continue to volunteer as co-director of the SU Leadership Conference in Springwood.

## How has Bill Andersen's work with SU impacted you?

Despite not having known Bill personally, his passion for raising young leaders continues as a priority for SUNSW. So in that respect, he has paved the way for SUNSW to give me the opportunity to learn leadership skills.



# Supporting young Christian leaders in Schools

God works in wonderful and often unexpected ways. It is a joy to witness how God continues to use the school setting to bring young people to know Jesus.

I first came to know Jesus at a local youth group where the Gospel was spoken clearly and faithfully from the Bible. God was also at work in the public high school I attended. The Scripture teaching helped me to understand more of the Bible as I started to put my faith in Jesus, and the ISCF group fostered a space of fellowship where I could serve by teaching younger students what I had been taught. I am so grateful for these ministries that have shaped me as a follower of Jesus.

God is at work everywhere and works in wondrous ways. Four years ago I applied for this job thinking it would be only application writing experience. However, God opened the door for me.

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As one of the only Christian teachers at the school, I am so glad that I can provide supervision and support to this group of teenagers who want to know about Jesus. Praise God for this ministry! It fostered my growth as a young Christian when I was in high school, and now it's a joy to be a witness to the same thing happening at the school where I work.

Our ISCF group is run by senior student leaders. They write and run Bible studies for younger students, support Christ-centred fellowship in the school setting, meet together to make decisions for the group, and organise additional SU activities (like camps and day conferences) in holiday periods.

As COVID restrictions have eased, years 7-12 students have been able to meet again in person. Our ISCF group partners with another local school, allowing us to organise larger combined gatherings which the students really enjoy. As ISCF student leaders transition from year 11 to 12, the older leaders have been mentoring the younger ones, meeting together to plan gatherings and Bible studies.

During the autumn holidays, Luke and Ling Shooter from St Thomas' Anglican Church North Sydney ran a leadership training day for the ISCF leaders from both high schools. Luke broke down the book



of Ephesians and the students were supported in developing main points and Bible studies from passages in the book. The studies the students develop will be used during Term 3 in combined ISCF gatherings.

It is such a blessing to have this church oversee Scripture teaching and support the ISCF groups. Last year, I was greatly encouraged when I received an email from some of the parents of the ISCF students, sharing with me that there was a collection of 10 or so parents who meet fortnightly via zoom to pray for school scripture and ISCF meetings. God is at work and it's a privilege to partner with him to share the Good News with young people in schools.

#### 'Christian Teachers Connect' Update

We were delighted to have over 70 DoE Christian teachers attend our online *Christian Teachers Connect* event in March.

Our two guest speakers shared some wonderful stories of seeing God at work in their schools, and wisdom on how teachers can shine God's love and care in their community. A great encouragement resulting from this event was a group of teachers committing to meet regularly to pray for their local schools.
