What and When?

Years 5–6 in NSW public primary schools

Usually meet weekly at lunchtime on school premises with an adult leader approved by SU NSW. May be known by another name for identity and promotion purposes.

Years 7–12 in NSW public high schools

Usually meet weekly at lunchtime on school premises with student leaders and/or an adult leader approved by SU NSW. May be known by another name for identity and promotion purposes.
